These men live on forever in the hearts of those they saved a nation truly grateful for the path of peace they paved.



A SHELLER


Lest we forget This has to be shared. An incredible poem from 14 year old

Mail leaves for Sydney Thursday 11 p.m. via Moruya, and by Merimbula steamers.

Mail arrives at Sydney Monday 7.15 a.m., and by Merimbula steamers.

Route – Steam Clyde River, or via Eden, or via Merimbula 20 m. Bega.

WOMEN OF BEGA.

Mrs Jane Underhill nee Kirkland.

Known as Granny Underhill in her old age, Jane Kirkland was born 11 August 1824 in County Donegal Ireland, duaghter of Henry and Sarah Kirkland.

The family came to Australia in1839 and lived at Moruya prior to her moving to Bega after her marriage.

Jane married Thomas Underhill, an ex convict, at Mount Oldrey, Moruya on 2 March 1842. Her wedding present was a side saddle which she rode seventy five miles to her new home which was rented from the Imlay Brothers at Tarraganda.

The side saddle is on display at the Bega Pioneers' Museum. Thomas, a blacksmith for the Imlay Brothers, and Jane had thirteen children.

In the 1851 floods Jane, with four young children and another on the way, was stranded on a hill whilst her house and possessions were washed away. They built a new house at 'Yarranung' where Thomas set up his forge and later opened a blacksmiths shop at Stony Creek.

Their eldest son, Henry, bought the Bega Family Hotel in about 1869 and Thomas and Jane came into town and managed it for the rest of their lives. Thomas died in 1898 and Jane on August 6th 1915.

George Blacker from Clutton, Somerset arriv on sailing ship 'Gold Conda'. Left Liverpool in 1858. Geo Blacker worked firstly for Trustees of Parramatta Park then came to Bega in 1861. They worked a farm on Tathra Rd for 7 yrs (later owned by Mannings) and purchased 'Woodstock' in 1868.
